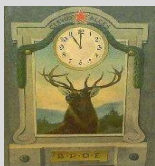

The following motion was made by myself at our regular meeting on June 3, 2009 and was seconded by Robert Murphy Jr. It reads as follows:

**"Motion to change ARTICLE X: FEES AND DUES, Sec. 2, Paragraph 3 of our By-Laws to state:
The regular Lodge dues shall be \$54.00 per year."**

THIS WILL NOT INCREASE ANY REGULAR MEMBERS DUES! What it does is get us in compliance with Grand Lodge. We currently have to make our dues equal to the total cost of our dues plus Grand Lodge per capita and State per capita. With the \$14 GL and \$2 State per capita added to our \$54, it would equal our current dues for Regular members of \$70. And just a notice to the Life and Honorary Life Members: our By-Laws state that we should be charging \$7.50 (plus \$16) = \$23.50 and we have only been charging \$20, so please expect an increase next year. Just a head's up. Sorry about the increase, but I really have no choice in the matter.

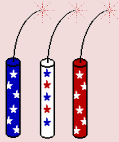
